about their movements creatively.

Music is so important in the early years. It teaches many of the essential pre-reading skills such as rhythm and rhyme. It develops listening skills, concentration, sound discrimination, group cooperation, sequencing and memory skills. The only disadvantage of these lively lessons is that whichever of the catchy songs we use, I am still humming a week later!

I cannot recommend any of these KMC resources too highly to other teachers either to support your teaching or to provide attractive music for entertainment.
